The Project

Metamorfose Urbana is a transdisciplinary exhibition that rethinks photography as a starting point rather than an end result. Born in Lisbon in 2024, the exhibition opens a new chapter in Paris in June 2026 — the very city that inspired the photographs.

The concept

Photographer Frédéric Bourret offered his photographs of Paris as a blank canvas. Each invited artist was free to take ownership of the image: paint over it, extend it, reinvent it according to their own sensibility. The result is a visual dialogue between two cultures and two ways of seeing the city.

One photograph. Twenty-eight artists. Twenty-eight metamorphoses.

In practice, each artist received a photographic print of Paris. They were free to intervene however they wished: paint directly onto the surface, add collage, drawing, embroidery, graffiti — or respond with an entirely new creation inspired by the photograph. The only framework: the photograph as a starting point. Everything else belongs to the artist.

Hybrid works

The result is a collection of hybrid works where painting, street art, haute couture, sculpture, illustration, comics, tattoo and music intersect. Each piece bears the dual imprint of the photographer and the guest artist — a two-voice dialogue on the same fragment of city.

The ambition of Paris 2026

After Lisbon, the 2026 edition moves to the heart of the City of Light. For this new edition, the project expands to twenty-seven creators from five countries — Portugal, France, Brazil, India and the United States — with the ambition to bring even more perspectives to bear on Paris. 84 rue du Temple becomes a transdisciplinary creative laboratory.

At the origin of Metamorfose Urbana, Frédéric Bourret offered his Parisian photographs as a blank canvas, upon which each artist was invited to leave their signature — reinventing these urban landscapes through their own perspective and imagination.

Frédéric Bourret has exhibited around forty times, from New York to Berlin, from Geneva to Paris. His work is recognised by collectors and specialists alike, as well as by a wide public who appreciates his series of ever-renewed themes and approaches. Three books have been published entirely dedicated to his work.
